Hang on to your card.

You can continue to use your card to get medical care until you turn 26.

To qualify you must:

- Be under 26 years old;
- Live in Louisiana; and
- Have been in foster care when you turned 18.

You should always keep in touch with the Medicaid office.

- If you move, let us know your new address.
- If you move out of state, you will no longer qualify for coverage in Louisiana, but we may be able to help you find coverage in your new state.
- If you leave Louisiana and come back before you turn 26, let us know. You will still qualify for coverage.

Former Foster Care is the state's health coverage program for former foster care recipients. There are no income requirements for the Former Foster Care Program, and having other kinds of health insurance in addition to Medicaid does not exclude enrollment. Other benefits include:

- No premiums, co-pays or deductibles;
- Access to a full range of services, including in-patient, dental, and prescriptions.
