








Premature Deaths: 58,375





Life Expectancy- Men






Determinants of Health and Their Contribution to Premature Death











Excessive Drinking Self-Reported Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance (BRFSS) 2006-2012










High School Dropout Percentages




LA Department of Education Annual Student Dropout Rates by State, District and Site 2013-2014
